


HOW GOD USES AUTHORITIES TO DEVELOP CHARACTER

HOW TO CONQUER FEAR AND WORRY

The opposite of having a meek and quiet spirit is giving way to fear and worry. Fear is not of God, nor has He given us the spirit of fear. (See II Timothy 1:7.) Therefore, fear is from our adversary, the devil, who ". . . as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour: Whom resist stedfast in the faith, knowing that the same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world" (I Peter 5:8–9).

A roaring lion frequently frightens unsuspecting prey toward hidden members of the pride that lie concealed in tall grass, downwind of the obvious threat. As prey flee in the opposite direction of the perceived danger, they run right into the waiting mouths of the real enemy. The hidden lionesses need only spring from their cover to attack at very short range. When it comes to hungry lions, prey animals might do better running toward the known enemy rather than fleeing in fear.
