any human inventions, such as motor cars, need some method of keeping cool. Most cars are cooled by water flowing through a radiator. Air cools the water, which then cools the engine. But humans didn't invent cooling systems! Animals have ways of keeping cool, too.

One of the most amazing is the African Gazelle. These antelopes can run as fast as 64km/h (40 m.p.h.). Running that fast in the African heat could raise their temperature so high that their brain would be damaged. But the gazelle

has a very unusual and wonderful cooling system which cools the blood before it enters the Warm blood mixed with cooled blood

A pool of blood near its nostrils is cooled by its breathing. Blood vessels run through this, cooling the blood. This cool blood is then mixed with warm blood from the heart, cooling it before it enters the brain.

Tests have shown that



this cooling system works perfectly. A running gazelle's body temperature rose from 28° C. (82° F.) to 34°C. (93°F.), yet the temperature of its brain did not rise above 30°C. (86°F.). This is not high enough to

A car's cooling system has to work properly from the start to avoid damaging the engine, And gazelles could not have slowly evolved their wonderful cooling system. Their brains would have overheated and they would have died. God must have created gazelles this way in the beginning,

OD is good, and everything He made was


